

## **Enhancing Physical Education in Schools**Issue Brief


## A.2165

Introduced by Assemblymembers Ortiz, Galef, Morelle, Brennan, Koon, Millman, J. Rivera, Robinson, Titus, Tonko, Towns, Weisenberg

This legislation would enhance physical education requirements in all elementary and secondary schools.

Specifically this legislation would:

- ✓ Lower the required age for physical education in all public and private elementary and secondary schools from 8 to 5 years of age;
- ✓ Add new requirements for skills, especially lifetime skills;
- ✓ Ensure that the student to teacher ratio for physical education instruction is consistent with the student to teacher ratio for other curricular areas;
- ✓ Require daily physical education for grades K-8, including students with disabling conditions and those in alternative education programs;
- ✓ Require that students in elementary schools shall participate in physical education a minimum of 150 minutes during each school week, and that students in secondary schools shall participate for at least 225 minutes per week;
- Require physician certification for exemptions from participation in physical education courses;
- Require a method for assessment of attainment of physical education learning objectives; and,
- ✓ Integrate fitness testing into the curriculum as an instructional tool in secondary schools including measuring a student's ability to assess their fitness levels, set goals for improvement, and monitor progress in reaching set goals
